BSA TROOP 4 POLICY ON CONDUCT

It is the policy of Troop 4 and of the Boy Scouts of America that all scouting activities be conducted in a safe and wholesome environment. It is the expectation of the troop committee that all activities will take place in the spirit of the Scout Oath and the Scout Law. However, it is recognized that there will be times when exceptions to this proper behavior will occur.

Therefore, the consequences of misbehavior and nonobservance of the rules must be clearly communicated to all scouts, parents and adult leaders. To this end, the Committee hereby establishes the following Rules of Conduct that are to be observed by all scouts and adult leaders. The following are actions, which are specifically prohibited within Troop 4:

- Horseplay, hazing, inappropriate language and/or verbal abuse.
- Excessive boisterousness which disturbs the enjoyment of the outdoors by others.
- Rock throwing that might injure, or unsafe use of fire or pyrotechnics.
- Possession, transportation or consumption of alcohol at any function involving scouts.
- The possession or use of illegal drugs.
- Assault, or the threat of force or violence directed toward any scouts or adult leader.
- Stealing or destruction of property.
- Open and persistent defiance of authority.

CONSEQUENCE OF UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR

Disregard for these rules or other misbehavior may result in one or more of the following consequences:

1. Verbal warning.
2. "Time out" from activities.
3. A telephone call home to parents.
4. Parents asked to pick-up the scout from the camp outing (AT PARENTS' EXPENSE).
5. Expulsion from the troop.
